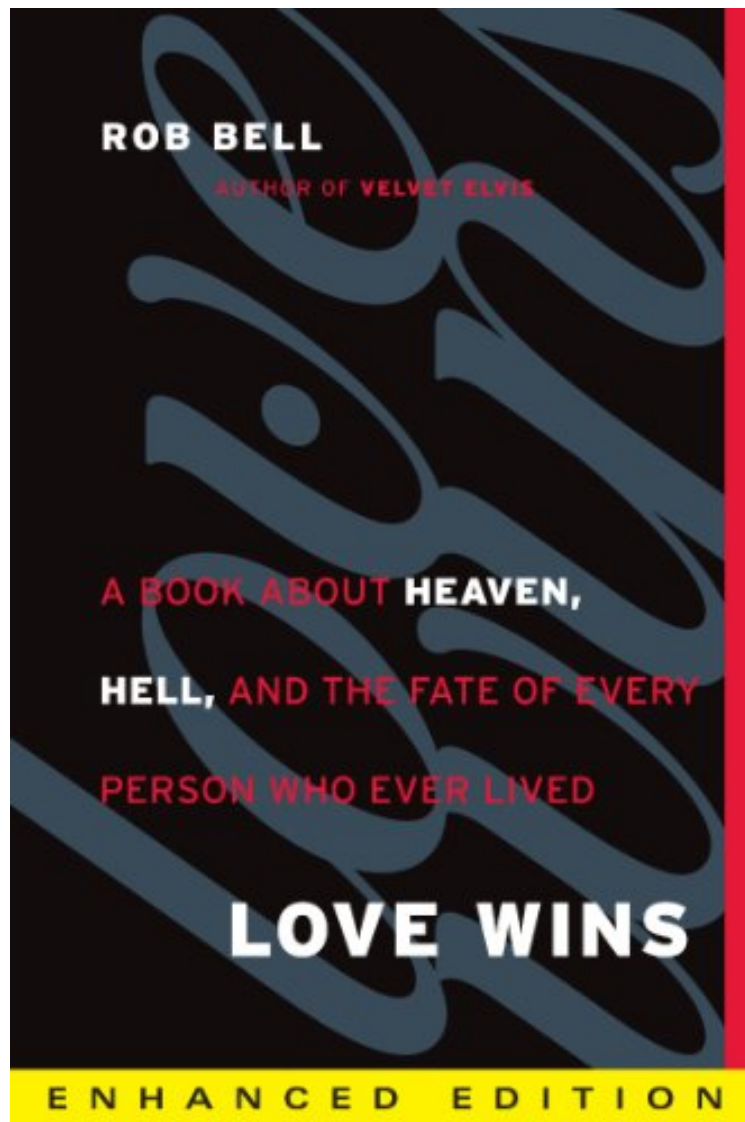

Dies ist meiner Meinung nach die grössten Stärken.Nun also zum zweiten Punkt, nämlich die Schwächen (Oder welche es in meinen Augen sind):Zum einen ist es seine Methode. Was mich stört und ist die Art wie er andere Meinungen beinahe ins Lächerliche zieht. Er äussert, was die anderen angeblich glauben. Es werden einzelne Aussagen aus dem Kontext genommen und daraus ein Feindbild konstruiert, welches kaum ein Christ verteidigen würde. Dies mag rhetorisch sehr wirksam sein. Es ist in meinen Augen jedoch moralisch falsch. Da stört mich auch, wie er mit der Kirchengeschichte umgeht. Luther und Augustinus und andere grosse zu sich selbst ins Boot holen anhand von einzelnen Aussagen finde ich ziemlich dreist. Wer einmal die Auslegung von Augustinus über Römer 9 gelesen hat, der weiss sehr genau, dass dieser das Gegenteil von Rob Bell vertritt. Genau so auch Luther, mit seiner Antwort an Erasmus von Rotterdam in dem Buch "Vom geknechteten Willen". Dies grossen der Kirchengeschichte in so einer respektlosen Weise zu behandeln ist kaum der richtige Weg. Auf der einen Seite steht Rob Bell und auf der anderen Leute wie Augustinus, Johannes Calvin, Martin Luther, Jonathan Edwards, John Owen, C.H. Spurgeon, Martin Lloyd-Jones, C.S. Lewis, R.C. Sproul, Wayne Grudem, etc... Welche, vor allem die erste genannten, grössten in der Kirchengeschichte gewesen sind. Daher würde ich mehr sorgfältig erwarten, wenn es um eine Widerlegung geht (über grosse Strecken des Buches ist es eine Widerlegung der orthodoxen evangelikalischen Sicht). Sicherlich haben sich auch diese in einzelnen Worten geirrt. Die Bereinstimmungen über die Jahrhunderte ist jedoch nicht wegzudiskutieren.Was auch strend ist, über weite Strecken des Buches stellt Rob Bell mehr oder weniger nur Fragen und beantwortet diese mit einer nächsten Frage. Am Ende kommt dann eine Frage, welche so gestellt ist, dass sie schon fast rhetorischer Art ist und die Antwort klar impliziert wird. Auf die vorhergehenden Fragen wird dann aber nicht mehr wirklich Stellung genommen, was dazu führt, dass auch dort die Antworten impliziert wird. So würden aber die meisten die am Anfang gestellt Frage auf sich alleine gestellt anders beantworten. So bleibt am Ende beim Normalverbraucher sehr viel Verunsicherung zurück.Der Eindruck, welcher das Buch bei mir hinterlassen hat ist, dass es in einer masslosen Arroganz geschrieben wurde und in einer Berheblichkeit, welche ich nur selten erlebt habe.'DOUBT IS THE NEW FAITH' halt.
