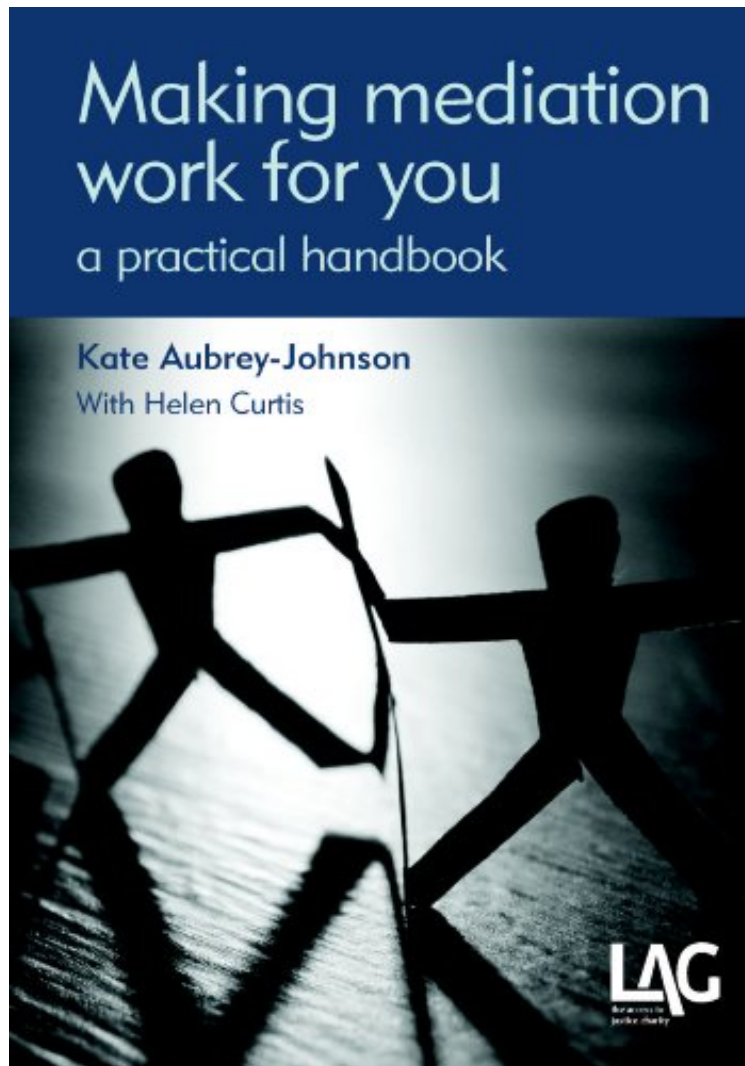

What wonderful time-savers these two latter attributes are! In the words of Harry Woolf, 'this book should provide all the ammunition needed to conduct a successful mediation,' adding that it 'deals simply and clearly with the hazards of mediation' and should (therefore) become 'the standard companion of mediators'. providing a way in which the citizen can, even without legal aid, find a way of resolving his or her problem'.
