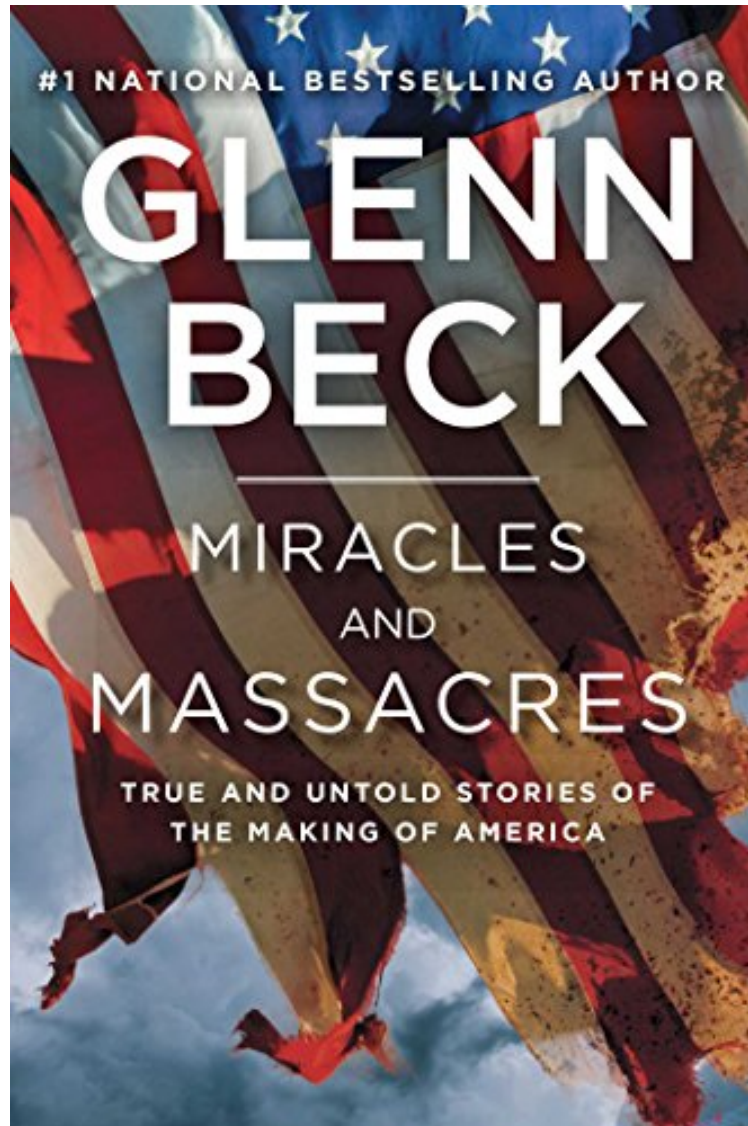

The author managed to tell his story in a thrilling and captivating way, that together with the fact that these are all true stories makes this book a great literature for readers interested in historical topics. It is significant that the author started and finished work with two very important events - first is named "Jack Jouett: The Ride That Saved America" telling the story from 18th century when foundations of American state were placed, and last story being the sad one about the 9/11 tragedy that forever changed America, story about the day that all think they know everything about but still Beck is able to show us something new and beautiful.... In other stories, the author referred to the ten other exciting and important events from past, enabling reader to learn more about Edison, My Lai massacre, World War II radio host "Tokyo Rose", Virginia Convention, Battle of Athens and some more.
