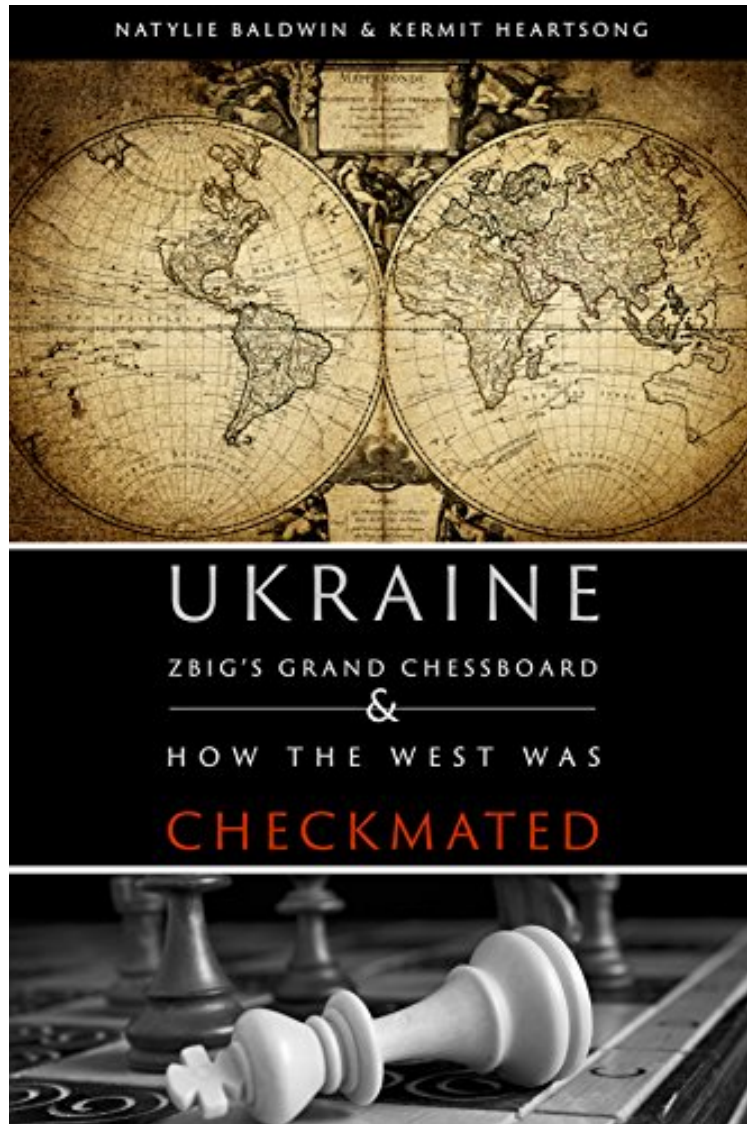

Ausgehend von Zbigniew Brzezinski's "The grand chessboard" wird deutlich gemacht, wie die Neocons immer noch die amerikanische Politik beherrschen und wie wenig die europäischen Politikern einsehen, dass die amerikanischen Interessen ganz anders sind als die europäischen. Der erste Teil, von Baldwin geschrieben, ist sehr gut. Der zweite Teil, von Heartsong geschrieben - angeblich ein "empirischer Wissenschaftler" - ist meistens korrekt, aber die Quellen sind teilweise mehr als fragwürdig. Hier werden Quellen angegeben, die nicht immer ganz seriös sind und teilweise im Bereich der Verschwörungstheorien gehen. Etliche im Text angegebene Quellen sind nicht unter den Referenzen wiederzufinden. Manchmal gleitet Heartsong im Text in einer emotionale Polemik hinein. Starker erster Teil, etwas zu unkritischer zweiter Teil Von Patrick Bucher Wie bereits bemerkt wurde, geht Heartsong durchaus etwas schlampig mit den Quellen um. Vieles, was russische Quellen verlauten liessen, bernimmt er unkritisch. Auch habe ich etliche Quellen nicht im Anhang gefunden. Per Google sollte sie finden können, aber von einem Quellenverzeichnis erwarte ich eben, dass mir die Eigenrecherche erleichtert wird. Der erste Teil ist aber durchaus gelungen und auch sprachlich brillant. Der zweite Teil liest sich dann etwas zu sehr wie eine Gegendarstellung. Der Zustand der russischen Wirtschaft und der Streitkräfte wird möglicherweise etwas zu rosig dargestellt. Und die Allianz zwischen Russland und China ist trotz aller Rekordverträge sicherlich auch von gegenseitigem Misstrauen geprägt.
